About the Conference:

The Islamic world's relations with Spain stand out as one of the most interdependent, interrelated in global civilization. The legacy of Andalusia refers humanity to the valuable, scientific, cultural, artistic and economic impact that Islamic civilization left in Spain over the eighth to the fifteenth century AD. Where Andalusia was an important cultural centre in the Middle Ages, it left profound impacts in many areas. It was the precursor and foundation of the modern European renaissance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, some Western and Orientalist studies deviated from their objective scientific approach and were linked to colonial objectives, constituting a source of tension for Western Islamic relations in general and Spanish-Islamic relations in particular. Andalusian legacy has not been invested in its proper context.

Many articles and literature have been written in Andalusian legacy, approaches have proliferated to the complexity of truth and relationship, ranging from the evolution of interpretative methods that are used in various themes of Andalusian legacy, Islamic presence in Andalusia and Islamic-Spanish relations.

What augurs well for a new opening in the course of Andalusian studies and Spanish Islamic relations are the striking shifts in contemporary Spanish Orientalism. After much of it was ingrained in European orientation methods, contents and goals, in terms of attempting to interpret the East into an edgy theme that would be a subjective stereotype. New studies have emerged in Spain and the West, departing from the tradition of classical Oriental studies, and taking objective cognitive methodologies in studying and analysing Andalusian legacy; language, literature, beliefs, legislation, politics, science, thought, culture and society.

It was therefore necessary to examine these shifts in the course of interaction with the Andalusian legacy from the very early days and to take stock of developments in contemporary studies, particularly in the context of the Spanish Orientalism. Take advantage of it in identifying the

features of new interpretations and insights related to the relations of the Arab and Islamic world and Spain in its positive endeavours. Then activate the cultural communality and work to build fruitful cultural relations that benefit both civilizations.

Objectives of the Conference:

- 1. Strengthening the relations of the Islamic world and Spain in its positive aspect. And investing the Andalusian legacy in closer cooperation in various fields. Considering this legacy as a practical path in the course of these relations.
- 2. Exploring new invisibility in Andalusian legacy, new studies and theses.
- 3. Identification of new Oriental and Western studies and Exceptionalism studies concerning Spain in the Arab world and evaluation of its approaches and conclusions.
